





REPORT OF THE GRAND SECRETARY

To the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge, Ancient, Free and Accepted
Masons of Nebraska:

I herewith submit my annual report as Grand Secretary:

It is a far cry from the reports made over the last several years. A few years ago, it was an exception to find a Lodge that was busy and active. Today, it is very much of an exception if you find a Lodge that is not active. Many of our Lodges are entirely too busy. However, there are a small number of Lodges which apparently are not contributing anything to Freemasonry, or its advancement, in this Grand Jurisdiction. There may be the best excuse in the world for all of these Lodges, but it would seem to me that a careful survey should be made of all such Lodges at this time, looking to their consolidation, or the revitalization of their activity. Numbers do not add any strength whatever. We had better have fewer stronger Lodges than to have a large number of Lodges, some of which are just on the border line.

Having gone through the last depression or panic, whichever you want to call it, I would like to strongly urge that these weak lodges receive consideration now, so that when we come up to this time which is bound to come, our Lodges will be in condition to withstand the difficulty. We hear a lot of brave talk these days about a "New World," but in a few years from now this will all be forgotten about, and we will be back just where we were before, or maybe worse. This office has no right to make recommendations, but I know the need is here, and this is the time to do it.

We are pleased to report that there is no interest either due, or past due, on any farm loan, bond, or preferred stock owned by the Grand Lodge. There have been a large number of farm mortgages paid this year, and practically every mortgage has been reduced. If conditions exist for two more years as they have been, the Grand Lodge will be out of the farm mortgage business.

Every Lodge in the Jurisdiction completed their returns and sent them in on time, and all dues for the year 1944 have been paid in full.

It will be noted that the cash on hand for the George Washington Masonic National Memorial Association, and for the Nebraska Masonic War Service Fund, are separate from all other funds, and are not shown in the recapitulation of the funds of the Grand Lodge, as these are funds being held in trust for these two separate items, and are no part of the Grand Lodge funds.

RELIEF NOTES

Travel conditions have been even worse this year than last year. We have, however, serviced the Relief Notes and have received \$835.00 in response to letters written to the Brethren to whom this money was ad-

vanced. The total amount advanced to the Brethren during the year 1932 on this particular relief program was \$16,775.00. There is still outstanding \$7,424.90.

GRIEVANCES

Petition for restoration has been received from Samaritan Lodge No. 158. This petition will have to be held until such time as the Grand Lodge meets, when it will be referred to the Committee on Grievances.

FIFTY-YEAR BADGES

During the past year, 57 Fifty-Year Badges have been presented to the Brethren entitled to receive them.

FARM MANAGEMENT

Farm No. 8, 80 acres in Thurston County, was sold this year at \$90.00 per acre. A profit was made on this sale. This leaves 5 farms, three of them being good farms, one medium farm, and one farm which is not good. This latter farm has been on the books, first as a mortgage, and later as a farm, for more than 35 years. From present indications, we have a very good prospect to sell a farm in the next few weeks.

The farms that have been sold, were sold at a profit of \$8,132.04, which is being carried in the farm profit and loss account, until the balance of the farms are sold.

CONSOLIDATION OF LODGES

The following Lodges were consolidated during the year:

Elk Creek Lodge No. 90 was consolidated with Tecumseh Lodge No. 17, Tecumseh, Nebraska, on November 11, 1944.

Riverton Lodge No. 63 was consolidated with Franklin Lodge No. 264, Franklin, Nebraska, on May 16, 1945.

ROLL OF HONOR

Lodges reporting no delinquent dues for the year 1944.

We have this year the largest number of Lodges ever to report having no outstanding dues. Many Lodges are carrying just a few members on their books, past due. May we pass along a suggestion that you either collect these dues, or if a Brother cannot pay his dues, remit them and keep your dues cleaned up. It is not so much that you get your name on the honor roll, but it means a lot to every Lodge to have their affairs in a business-like condition.

LODGE FINANCES

May it be urged that every Lodge carefully go over their financial situation. This is the time to get your affairs in such condition, that if and when another depression strikes, the Lodges may be in position to withstand the difficulties and to weather the storm.

GOVERNMENT BONDS

All Government Bonds purchased have been retained by the Grand Lodge, which last year amounted to \$148,000.00.

During the Sixth War Loan, the Grand Lodge purchased \$50,000.00 additional bonds. Orders will be placed for \$75,000.00 Seventh War Loan Bonds during the Seventh War Loan, making a total amount of Government Bonds purchased this year of \$125,000.00.

It was impossible to purchase the \$75,000.00 Seventh War Loan Bonds until June 16, because the Grand Lodge, A.'.F.'. & A.'.M.'. of Nebraska is a corporation, and therefore is not permitted to purchase the bonds until after that date. The Grand Trustees have passed upon this purchase of bonds, and the orders will be placed as soon as we are permitted to purchase them.

GRAND TRUSTEES, GRAND LODGE, A.'.F.'. & A.'.M.'

The Grand Trustees of the Grand Lodge have met several times during the year, to discuss finances of the Grand Lodge, and conditions generally. At every meeting, three or more of the Trustees have been present. As Secretary of the Board, I have been present at every meeting.



To the Master, Wardens, Officers and Members of every Subordinate Lodge in the State of Nebraska:

Brethren:

M.'.W.'.William C. Schaper, Grand Master of Masons, has appointed a Finance Committee, who have prepared the budget for the coming year.

Under the direction of the M.'.W.'.Grand Master, this budget is being sent by registered mail to each Subordinate Lodge in this Grand Jurisdiction.

The Edict issued by the M.'.W.'.Grand Master, under date of March 14, 1945, states:

"This will be the budget for the coming year, unless more than fifty percent of the Subordinate Lodges object, through their representatives, who would be entitled to vote if the Communication of the Grand Lodge were held June 5, 1945."

"The objections must be filed in writing in the office of the Grand Secretary, 401 Masonic Temple, Omaha, Nebraska, within fourteen days after receipt of the budget."

The enclosed copy of the budget and other material are sent to your Lodge, by order of M.'.W.'.William C. Schaper, Grand Master of Masons of Nebraska.

To the Most Worshipful Grand Master, Grand Officers, and Members of the Grand Lodge, A.'.F.'. & A.'.M.'. of Nebraska:

In compliance with the provisions of the Edict of M.'.W.'. William C. Schaper, Grand Master, dated March 14, 1945, the Committee on Finance has examined the books and accounts of the Grand Secretary, and the various Committees, and other units of the Grand Lodge having any part in the financial program of the Grand Lodge. We have also carefully reviewed the report of the auditors submitted by Greenfield & Carlson, and have examined all matters of finance which have in any way been referred to this Committee by the Grand Master, Grand Secretary, and Committees or individuals connected with the Grand Lodge. We respectfully report our findings for your consideration.

The General Fund budget for 1945, as determined by this Committee, shows a total of \$34,770.20, as indicated in the accompanying detail, and in consideration of the possibility of holding a Grand Lodge session during this year, we have made provision for expenses incident to such a meeting. A salary adjustment due to the employment of an assistant to the Grand Secretary, has been made; the Grand Secretary having voluntarily proposed a reduction of \$1,200 per year in his salary.

We have made a list in accordance with practice of previous years, showing a comparison between the General Fund budget adopted one year ago, and the actual expense incurred during this Masonic year. This comparison reflects a net saving of \$2,840.22, which is also submitted in detail as a matter of permanent record as to our findings in this connection.

We are also submitting a report of Special Appropriations required for the conduct of Grand Lodge business for the ensuing year, showing a total of \$24,523.60.

In conclusion, we are pleased to inform you that all funds are balanced, and that funds are available for purposes as recommended; also that the accounts of this Grand Lodge are in order for the regular conduct of business for the ensuing year, to the best of our knowledge and belief.
